

Who should take part in the Referendum?

All Zimbabwean citizens who are 18 years and above irrespective of gender, political persuasion, religion, colour or creed should vote in the referendum.

How is a Referendum determined?

The results of a Referendum are based on the majority votes on the question or issue to be decided at the referendum.

How to Vote?

Upon production of proof of identity a voter shall be issued with a ballot paper containing the question under consideration.

As a voter you are expected to vote either **YES** or **NO** with regards to the Question by placing an X in the appropriate marking space of your choice.

What is a Referendum?

This is a vote held to ascertain the views of voters on an issue of national importance.

Zimbabwe will hold a referendum on the 16th March 2013 to decide whether the country should adopt the new draft constitution or not.

Who proclaims a Referendum?

Referendum Act Section 39 of the Electoral Act Chpt 2.13 mandates the President of the Republic of Zimbabwe to proclaim the date(s) and times when the referendum is to be conducted.

The Referendum will be held on 16 March 2013

Who is entitled to Vote?

Any Zimbabwean citizen who is 18 years and above and is eligible to be registered as a voter on the Voters' Roll.

Your Vote is Your Voice

Is Registration Required

The current Law does not require persons to register to vote in a referendum but it requires one to bring his/her national identity.

Where Does One Vote?

For this referendum Zimbabwe is a singly constituency
At any polling station set up by the Zimbabwe Electoral Commission countrywide.

What Documents should be carried to the Polling station?

- A National Identity card or
- Green Waiting Pass with picture of holder or that is clear not washed or disfigured.
- A valid Zimbabwean Passport.
- A certificate of citizenship of Zimbabwe together with a national identity document, a waiting pass or a valid Zimbabwe passport.
